JERUSALEM COUNCIL VS. JERUSALEM COUNCIL

In the Jerusalem Council I, in the mid-first century, less than two decades after Jesus' resurrection, Jewish followers of Jesus honored His Great Commission by welcoming Gentiles.

In the Jerusalem Council II, 2,000 years after Jesus' resurrection, we as the Global Church reaffirm

Jesus' Great Commission through our synergistic commitment to share with all people groups the eternal hope God has made available in Jesus Christ.

In the Jerusalem Council I, the leaders said, "it seemed good to the Spirit and to us" (Acts 15:28). In essence, the Church concluded and has continued to "hear what the Spirit says to the churches" (Rev 2:7, 11, 17, 29; 3:6, 13, 22).

In the Jerusalem Council II, just as the Jerusalem Council I recognized, our mission is grounded in Scripture, in the good news of what Jesus Christ has done, and empowered by the Spirit. We must serve the global unity of Jesus' movement and our mission to the world.

The Jerusalem Council I was moved by the Spirit to become global, and now at the Jerusalem Council II, the Global Church must synergize to finish the Great Commission.





Human identity is not who we have become but who we are created to be. Jesus shows us the way to God, shows us the way to ourselves and the way to be human.

Who is needed to complete the Church's mission in the third millennium? Developing strategies to engage and empower young people in the life of the Church and God's mission in the world. Encouragement for the Church to engage changing times while remaining faithful to its mission.

What is the Spirit saying to the Church as to finishing the Great **Commission?**

What is needed in the Church in order complete its mission? For 2000 years the Church has strived and struggled to complete the Great Commission. Discussing ways to promote harmony and understanding among different denominations and traditions, with a particular attention to bridging the Eastern Orthodoxy and Western Christendom.

In the Seventh Plenary Session, the JCII Group will travel together to the Acropolis to pray for the nations and then proceed to Mars Hill. At the Herodian Amphitheater (near Mars Hill), the theme will focus on Finishing the Great Commission. The JCII Group will collectively read and commit to becoming the Church of the Third Millennium.

When Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother who sins against me? Up to seven times?" Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy times seven." He was teaching Christ-followers to live with a spirit of forgiveness. To further exemplify this spirit of forgiveness, the JCII grand total will consist of 490 Christ-followers (missional strategists, New Testament scholars, church leaders, leading pastors, Bible translators, and church planters).

Hotel accommodations, roundtrip airfare, and visa fees (if applicable) are not included in the registration cost. Every delegate will receive two world-class dinners, one leadership luncheon, and specialized JCII leadership resources. The Jerusalem Council II will offer up to 100 scholarships. These scholarships are a partnership where the recipient pays half of the registration cost and covers the roundtrip airfare and visa fees (if applicable). The scholarships will cover hotel accommodations, meals, and half of the registration cost. They will be awarded based on the following criteria:

- 1. A Third Millennium Leadership standard established by the JCII Planning Team.
- Strategic location, particularly among the most unreached peoples.
